Calvin wrote in the preface to his commentary on the Psalms that when he was a young man, perhaps around twenty-one years old, God “turned my course in another direction.” By an unexpected or sudden conversion God subdued and “tamed to teachableness a mind too stubborn for its years.” Calvin’s wholehearted commitment to God was symbolized by the seal he adopted for himself: a flaming heart on the palm of an extended open hand and the words—“My heart, I give you, O Lord, promptly and sincerely.” That became for Calvin more than a seal, more than a motto; it set the direction for the rest of his life.
