Dear Reader of Session to Session:

The "Machen Tradition" insisted on the unhindered pursuit of truth. The value placed on this same tradition by the forefathers of the PCA was clearly demonstrated by the repeated offer to Dr. Machen of a professorship at Union Seminary in Virginia even as the controversy at Princeton was raging.

The Board of Machen's *Presbyterian Guardian* at the time of its merger with *The Presbyterian Journal* sought clear reassurances that this pursuit of truth would be continued unbroken. We may be thankful for the ministry of the *Journal* in this regard.

But now an organ for promoting the strengthening and growth of Biblical Presbyterianism in America is needed once more. Session to Session is committed to that goal.

One of the rarest commodities of the day is a gifted, qualified editor who also is committed to the "faith once delivered to the saints." Kenneth A. Myers combines the above characteristics as well as many more.
