“To God Be the Glory”

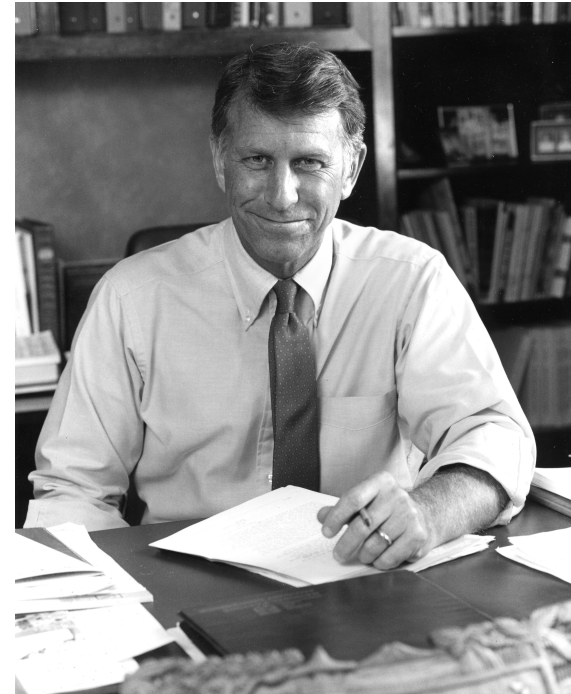
To God be the glory, great things He has done!

Frank Morehead Barker, Jr.

January 31, 1932 – December 27, 2021

His fourteen grandchildren and

Frank graduated from Ramsey High School in 1949.
He attended Auburn University, earned an engineering degree, then
became a Navy jet fighter pilot and flew during the Korean War.

After a few close calls flying off of aircraft carriers,
Frank believed that God was trying to get his attention.

To amend his ways, he decided to attend seminary and
began pastoring a small church in Oxford, AL.

For the first time Frank questioned what it meant to be a Christian.

An Air Force chaplain explained to him that salvation came by grace
through faith in Christ. His life was completely transformed.

In 1960 Frank started Briarwood Church in a storefront in Cahaba Heights.

There, he and Barbara (Brown) were married, and over the next 39 years
they served side by side watching God multiply the church and
magnify Himself through their ministry.

Fueled by a vision to “reach Birmingham to reach the world for Christ,”
Frank oversaw the founding of Briarwood Christian School, Birmingham
Theological Seminary, Campus Outreach, Briarwood Ballet, Briarwood Camp
and ministries to business and medical professionals.

In 1973 Frank helped to form the Presbyterian Church in America.
Until his final breath, he faithfully served the Lord and shared His Word.

He will be greatly missed by his family, his friends and thousands
upon thousands of those who came to know Jesus because of his life.
