Terry was born on January 29, 1949 in Jackson, MS, and died December 12, 2013 in Glenside, PA. After graduating from Oklahoma State University in 1971, he worked for 6 years as a mechanical engineer for the Naval Surface Weapons Center in Dahlgren, VA. He subsequently earned his Masters of Divinity from Westminster Theological Seminary in 1980, and went on to plant churches in Miami, FL, McAllen, TX, Harlingen, TX, and Raleigh, NC. Most recently, he served as the pastor of New Life Glenside Presbyterian Church. Throughout his ministry, his heart was in coaching and encouraging young pastors. Starting January 1, 2014, he was prepared to begin his new role as the Church Planter Development Director with Mission to North America. He is survived by Susan, his wife of 42 years, and their family.
